RECOGNITION ON A JOB  
WELL DONE



## Sergeant Timothy Smith (Bravo Patrol B2)

Sergeant Smith conducted an RTM check at Al Shaheen convenience store located in the 1500 block of Atlantic Avenue. Frequent complaints are received from the employees of the store and residents regarding quality of life issues and narcotic distribution. Upon entering the store, Sergeant Smith observed two males engaging in a drug transaction. Both males quickly retreated to the back of the store where one male attempted to hide an unknown object behind merchandise on a store shelf. Both males were quickly detained.

Sergeant Smith conducted a search of the merchandise and located a handgun and cocaine. The handgun was defaced and loaded with hollow point ammunition.

Sergeant Smith is to be recognized for a job well done!



# Officers Leah McHale, Courtney Campbell, Zayon Pitts, and Surveillance Center Personnel

Officers McHale and Campbell responded to two separate reports of a vehicle burglary. They located surveillance footage and determined the suspect was the same for both cases and created a flyer. The same day, Surveillance Center personnel located a possible suspect who was arrested by Officer Pitts.

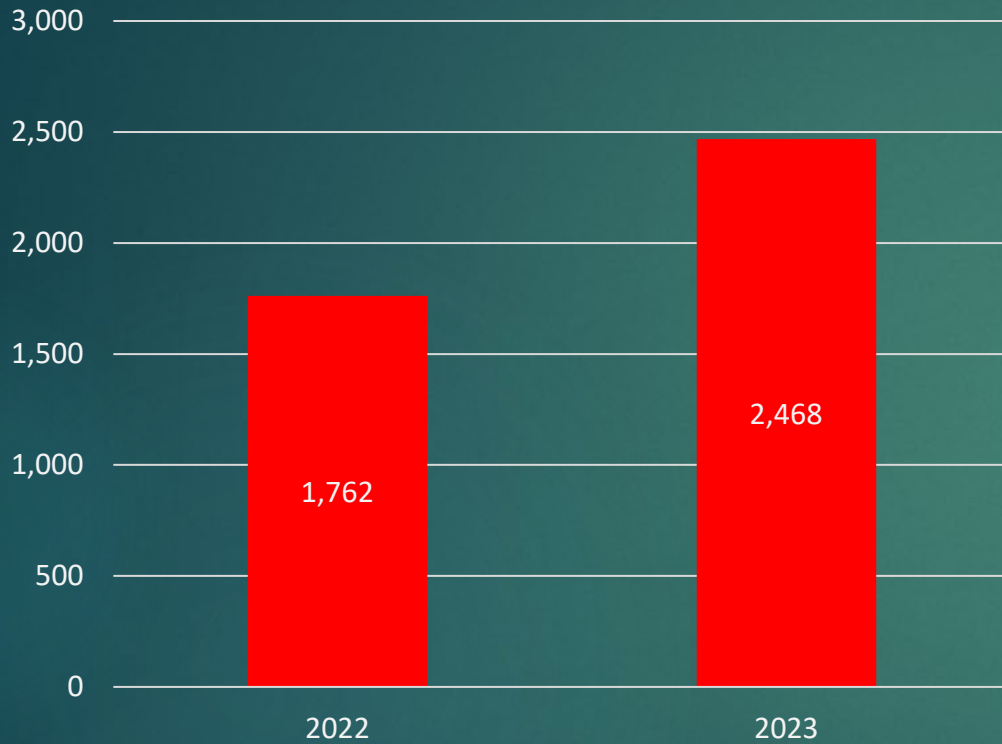
Officers McHale and Campbell took lead in the arrest of this suspect. Upon speaking with the suspect, they discovered he was homeless, a heavy narcotic user, had no income, had an extensive criminal record (including 21 other convictions with 10 of them for burglaries on motor vehicle) and had frequently failed to show up for his prior court proceedings. The arrest was completed consistent with the At Risk Initiative program. The officers were able to have the suspect detained at ACJF.

The arrest of this suspect appears to have had an immediate effect on criminal activity concerning motor vehicle burglaries in Atlantic City. In reviewing the CAD in the Pro-Phoenix system, there were thirteen reported incidents of car breaks from December 11 to December 13 (3 days), from Tennessee to Ohio Avenues and from Pacific to Arctic Avenues. Since the arrest of this suspect (December 13), there have only been three (3) reported incidents of car breaks within that same geographic area but over the course of eight days (December 14 to December 21). This is exceptional objective data that suggests a significant level of criminal activity was deterred with the arrest and incarceration of this suspect.

All are to be recognized for a job well done!

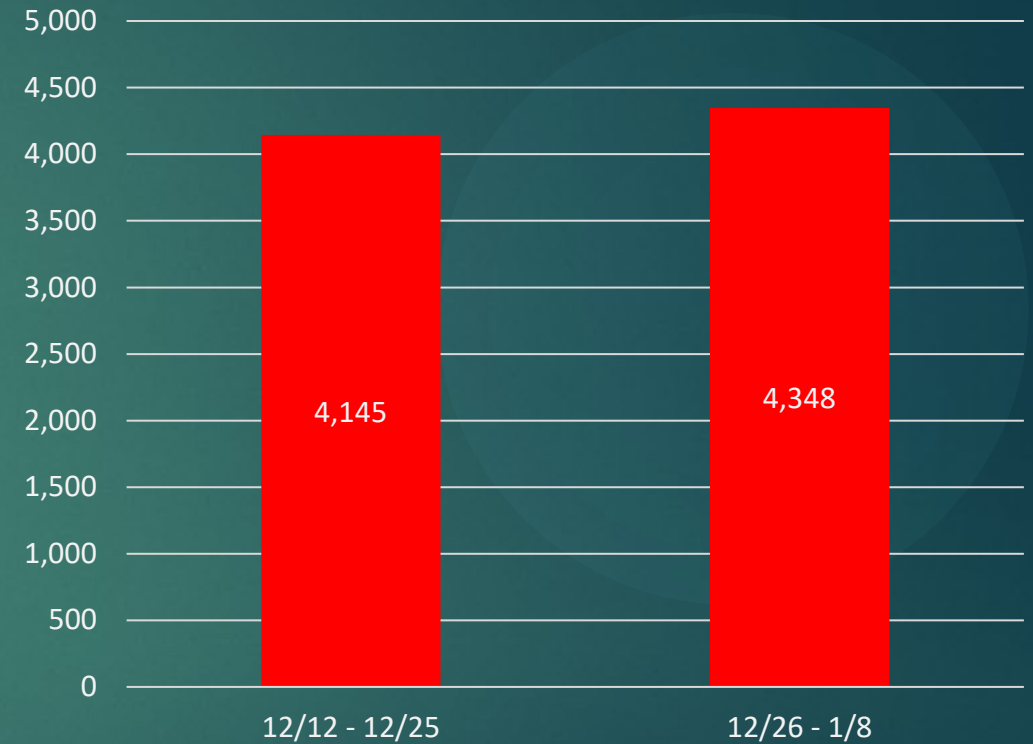
# Calls for Service Overview

Calls for Service are up **5%** from the week of Jan 8 vs Dec 25.



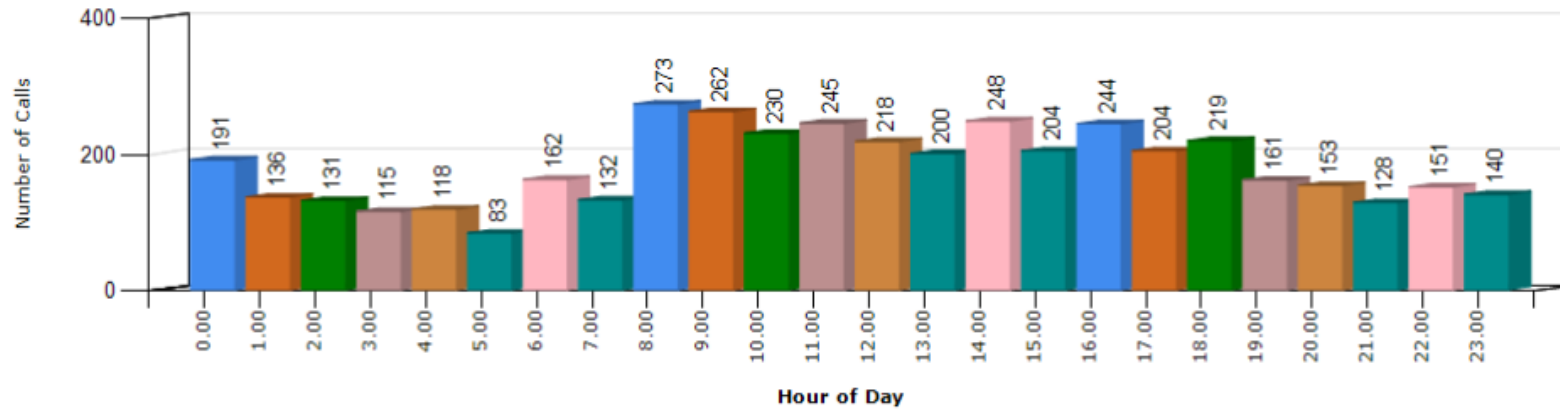

Dec 26 – Jan 8th

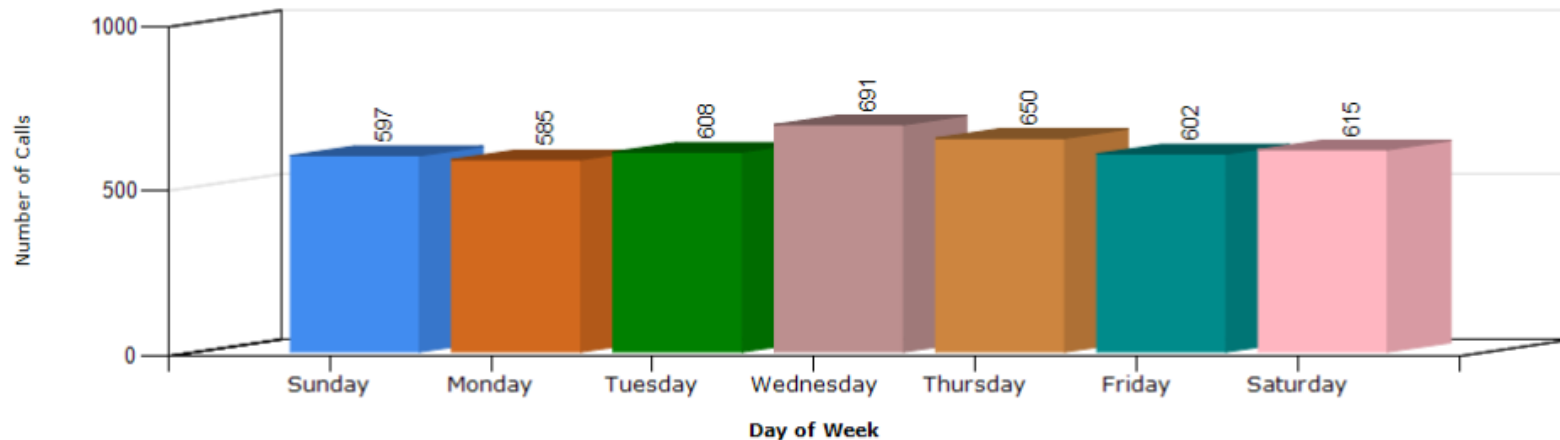

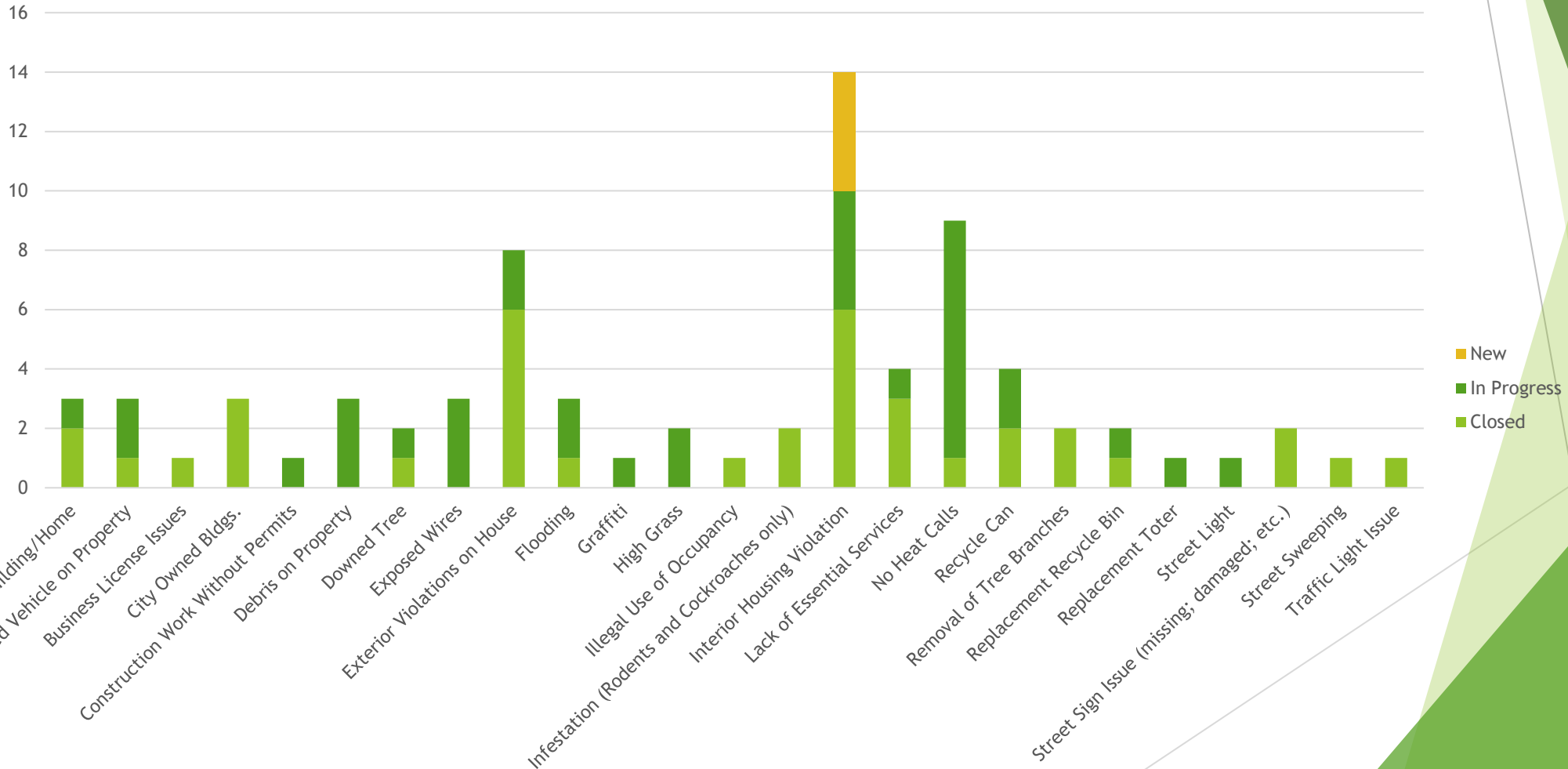

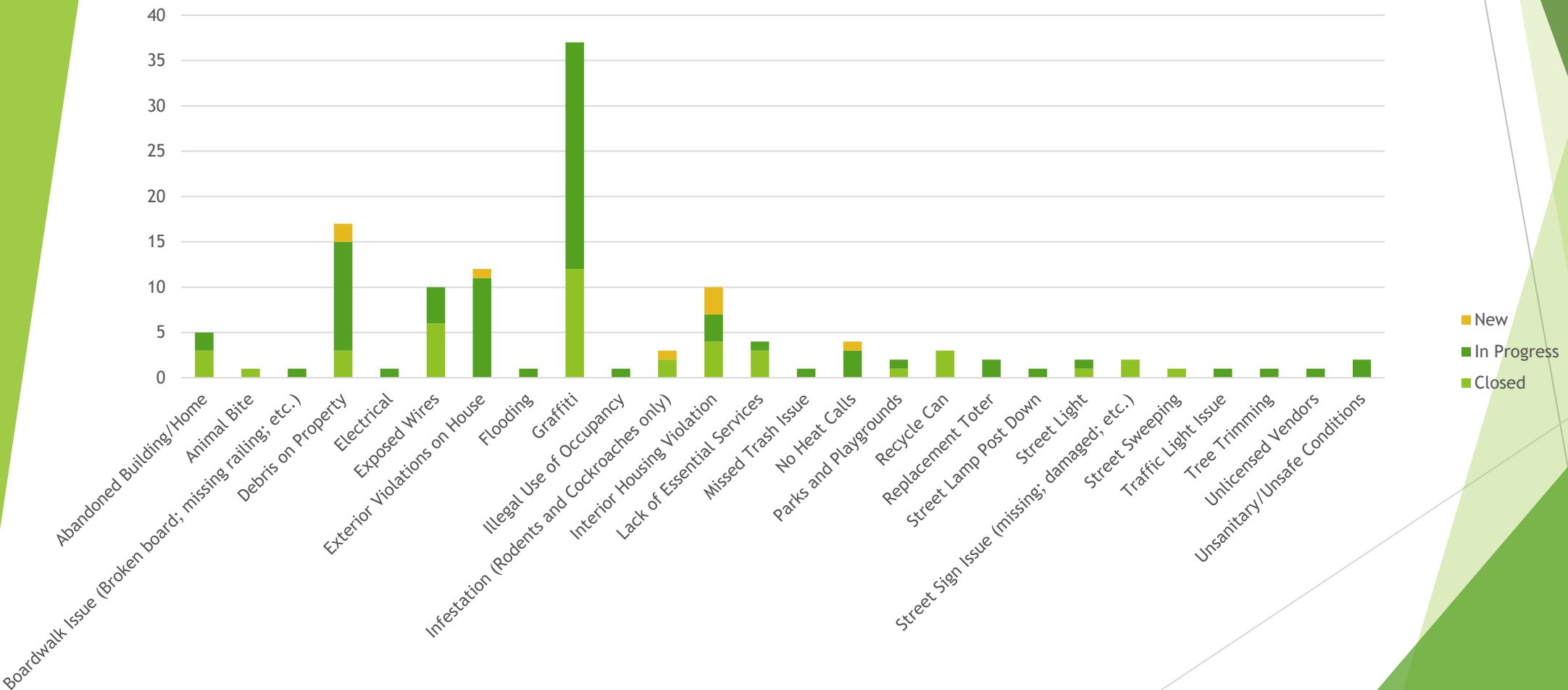
