Q:

Concern: What is being done/will be done to resolve the issues at the Caspian Ave Beach?

A:

Since May 1, 2022, there have been 132 calls for service to the area of that squares Maine/Caspian to Maine/Adriatic to NH/Adriatic to NH/Caspian. Of those calls, 42 are for a noise complaint and 39 for vehicles either in violation, suspicious, or other.

The ACPD is aware of these issues and has been addressing them. The vehicles that are parked on in the lot north of Caspian Avenue are on private property and not subject to towing.

Q:

Concern: We need speed signs and other indicators on Martin Luther King to ensure the traffic slows down and is safe for pedestrians.

A:

Officers were deployed to the area and conducted numerous motor vehicle stops in the area resulting in 18 speeding violations, four other violations and numerous warnings to drivers.

In addition, two solar speed signs have been put up on MLK Boulevard. One for southbound traffic in the area of the King Complex. One for northbound traffic in the 600 block of MLK Blvd.

Q:

Concern: What will be done to address the boarded up, worn down house on Ontario Ave?

A:

This property was inspected on February 1, 2023 and a Notice of Violations was issued and sent to the owner in Asbury Park for the following violations: Weeds, Vacant Structures and land, and Accessory structures.

Q:

Concern: What will be done to address the abandoned buildings on Penrose Ave and the homeless living there?

A:

Neighborhood Coordination Unit officers followed up. They conducted a walk thru of the abandoned property located at 1511 Penrose Avenue. The property was empty. The property was boarded up by Public Works on February 6.

1517 Penrose Avenue – This property was inspected by the Division of Code Enforcement on February 3, 2023 and a Notice of Violations was issued. The owner was given until February 15, 2023 to abate these violations. Notice to Repair, Occupy and/or Demolish is being sent to the owner notifying him of a Demolition Hearing for this property to be scheduled for February 21, 2023.

1519 Penrose Avenue – This property was inspected by the Division of Code Enforcement on January 27, 2023 and a Notice of Violations was issued. The owner was given until February 13, 2023 to abate these violations. A Notice to Repair, Occupy and/or Demolish is being sent to the owner notifying him of a Demolition Hearing for this property to be scheduled for February 21, 2023.

Q:

Concern: What will be done about the raccoons gathering at buildings on Penrose Ave?

A:

Traps were placed at both 1517 and 1519 Penrose Ave. due to both being abandoned homes with dilapidated garages that could allow for herbage and breeding of racoons. The traps were placed on Tuesday Jan. 31st and removed on Friday Feb. 3rd, during that time frame no raccoons were captured with the exception of one possum. Animal Control is moving up to the 1800 block of N. Arkansas Ave. for other raccoon complaints.

Q:

Concern: What is being done to address the abandoned home on New Jersey Ave?

A:

Property was inspected by Code Enforcement on November 22, 2022.

A Notice to Repair, Occupy and/or Demolish was issued to the owner of record, Mr. Jasper S. Reaves, advising that a Demolition Hearing was being scheduled for this property on Thursday, December 15, 2022.

The hearing was held on December 15, 2022 and the owner did attend.

Subsequent to the hearing an Order to Repair, Occupy, Remove or Demolish was issued on December 16th, which gave Mr. Reaves until January 16, 2023 to secure, renovate and obtain a Certificate of Occupancy. Failing this, the owner was given until January 30, 2023 to have the property demolished.

On January 26, 2023, correspondence was sent to the owner by Director Finch advising since the repairs were not made and no demolition permits have been applied for, the City would begin steps to have the property demolished.

Q:

Concern: People hanging out front of convenience store at 2519 Pacific Avenue.

A:

During the last 14 days, ACPD officers have arrested nine individuals for a variety of offenses in the area. There have been 38 calls for service to the store that includes 20 checks by officers on the store that was self-initiated.

Q:

Concern: Traffic lights on Virginia Ave to Melrose need to be adjusted so they don't hold as long when there is no traffic coming through.

A:

Traffic sergeant evaluated all of the traffic lights that are on Melrose Avenue/Mediterranean Avenue from Virginia to New Hampshire Avenues. The sergeant also evaluated the Route 30 and North Carolina Avenue intersection traffic lights. All were found to be operating appropriately with no excessive delays.

Q:

Concern: What actions officers can lawfully take when removing someone speaking at public forum?

A:

A person cannot willfully resist an officer in the discharge of his duty to keep the peace and order at an open public meeting. A person commits a disorderly persons offense if, with purpose or disrupt a lawful meeting, procession, he does an act tending to obstruct or interfere with it physically.

ACPD command staff had scheduled a meeting with Mr. Young on February 7 to review his concerns.

RECOGNITION ON A JOB
WELL DONE



Sergeant Joshua Schwenger, Officer Ivan Cruz and Officer Bayron Zelaya-Chavez- Bravo Platoon Squad 2 (Commanded by Lt. William Tracy)

Officers Cruz and Zelaya-Chavez located a vehicle that was wanted by the Violent Crimes Unit as part of a shooting investigation. The officers observed four males near the vehicle walk into a nearby convenience store. Three would later exit and enter the vehicle when it was stopped by the officers. One male was wanted as a part of the shooting investigation and taken into custody. Sergeant Schwenger located the fourth male hiding in the rear of the store. A loaded handgun was recovered inside a toilet tank.

All officers are to be recognized for a job well done!

Special Investigations Section Detectives (Commanded by Lt. Richard Andrews)

Members of the Special Investigations Section conducted two separate investigations resulting in numerous arrests. The investigations were in response to complaints from residents concerning illegal narcotics activity and quality of life issues throughout the area.

A surveillance operation in the 1800 block of Hummock Avenue and the execution of a residential search warrant in the 2000 block of Columbia Avenue led to the arrest of two males and three juveniles.

In total, detectives recovered four handguns, two ounces of heroin, 27 grams of cocaine, and prescription medication.

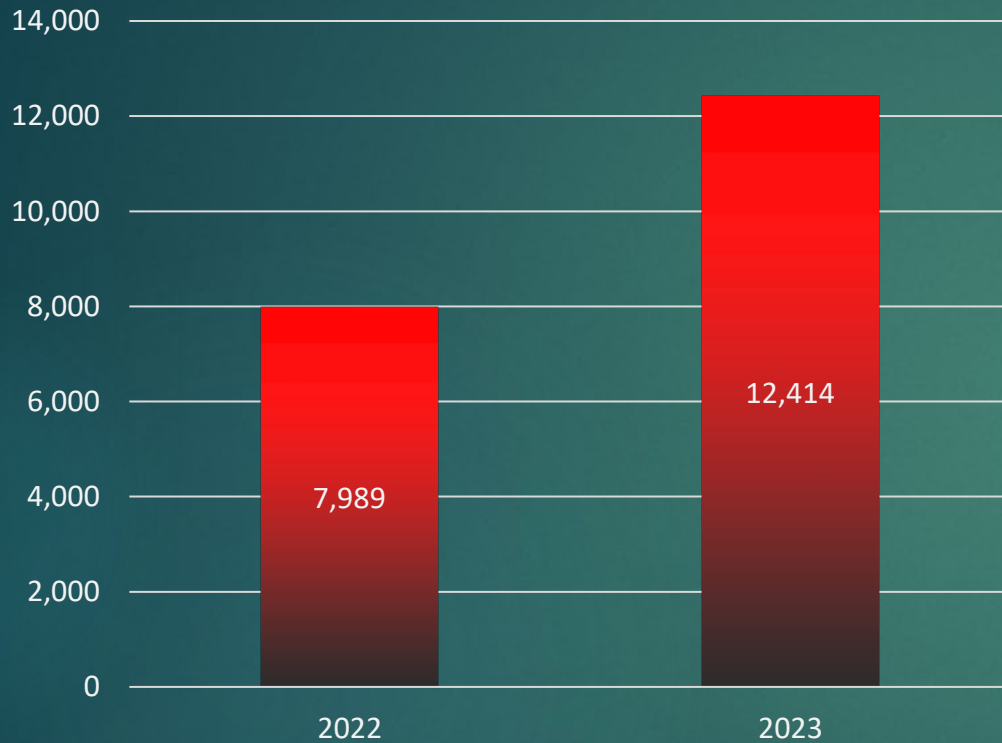

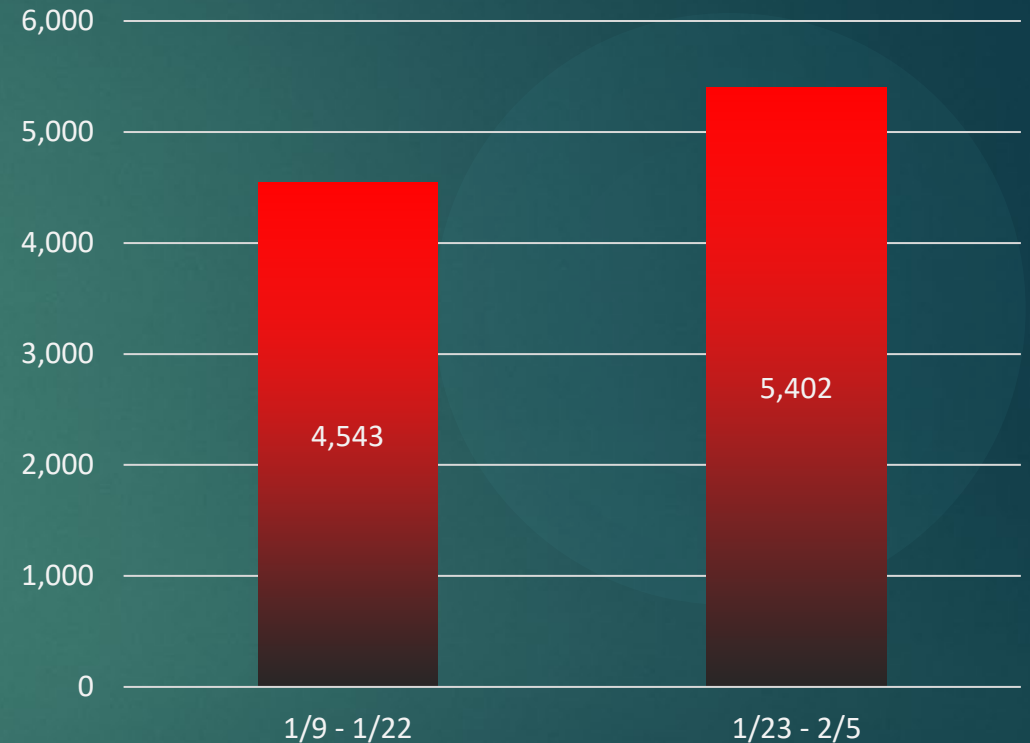
Calls for Service Overview

Calls for Service are up **19%** from the weeks of Jan 9 vs Jan 23

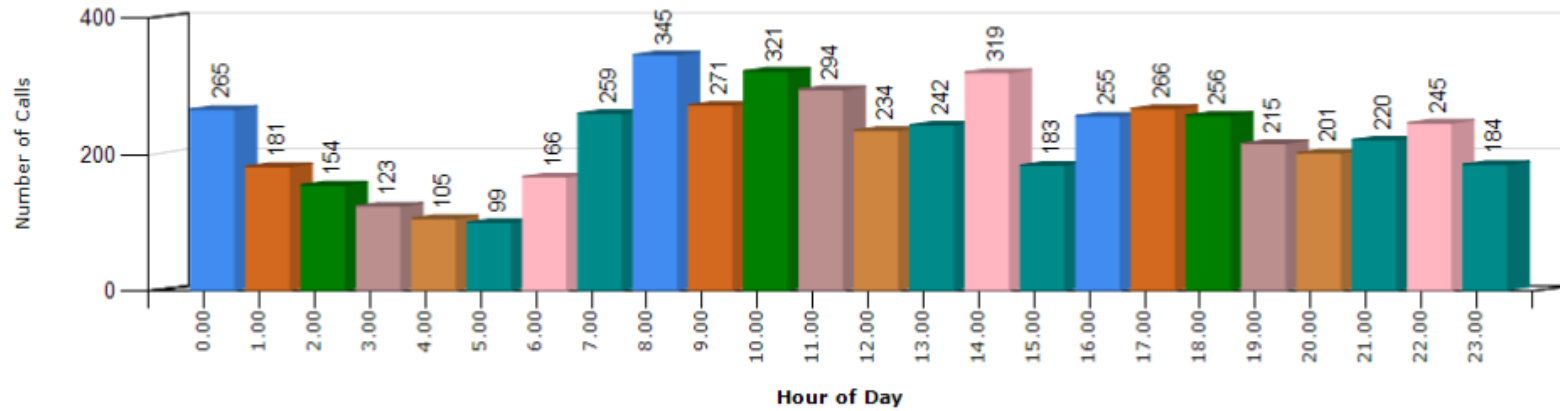

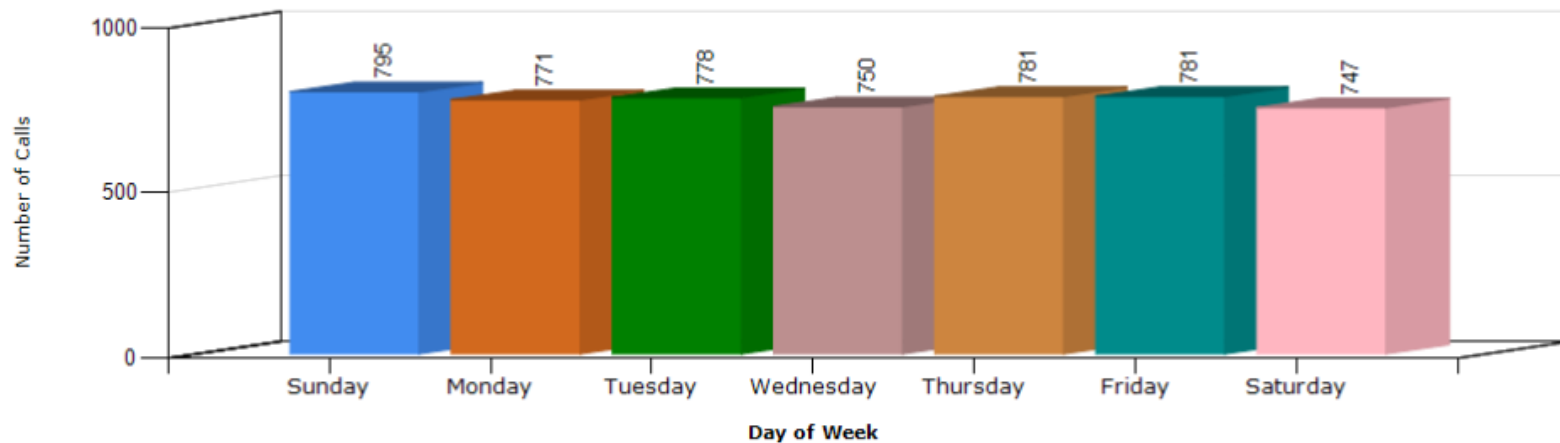

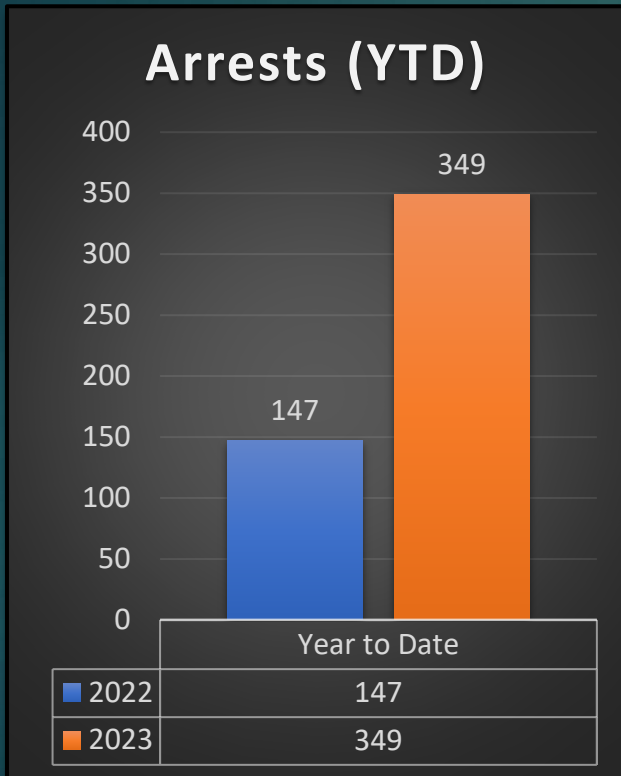
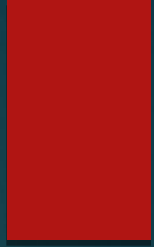
Number of Calls by Day of Week



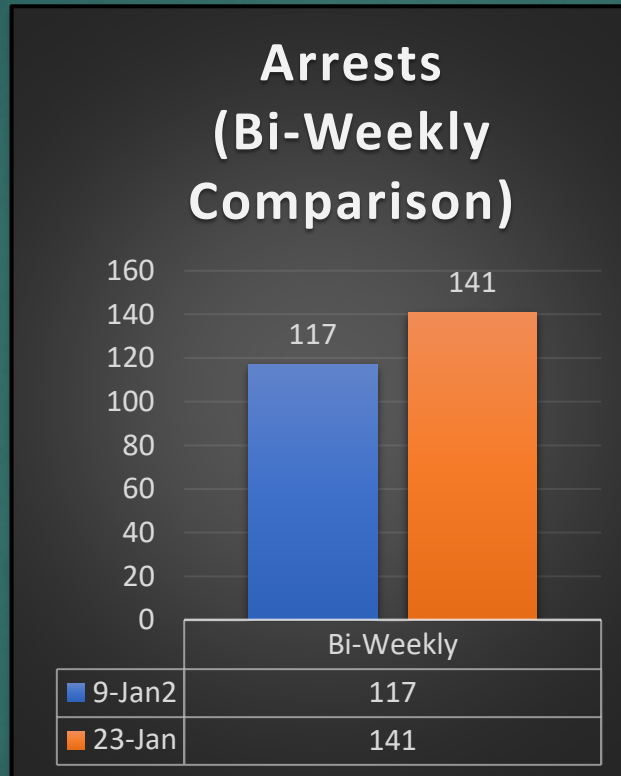

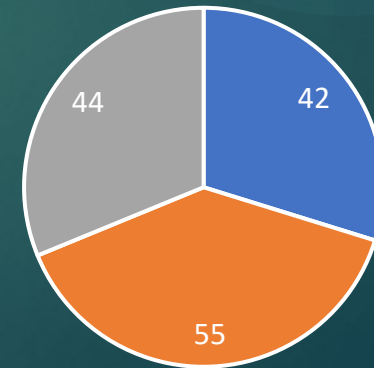

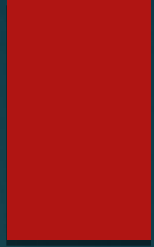

Arrests by Time of Day



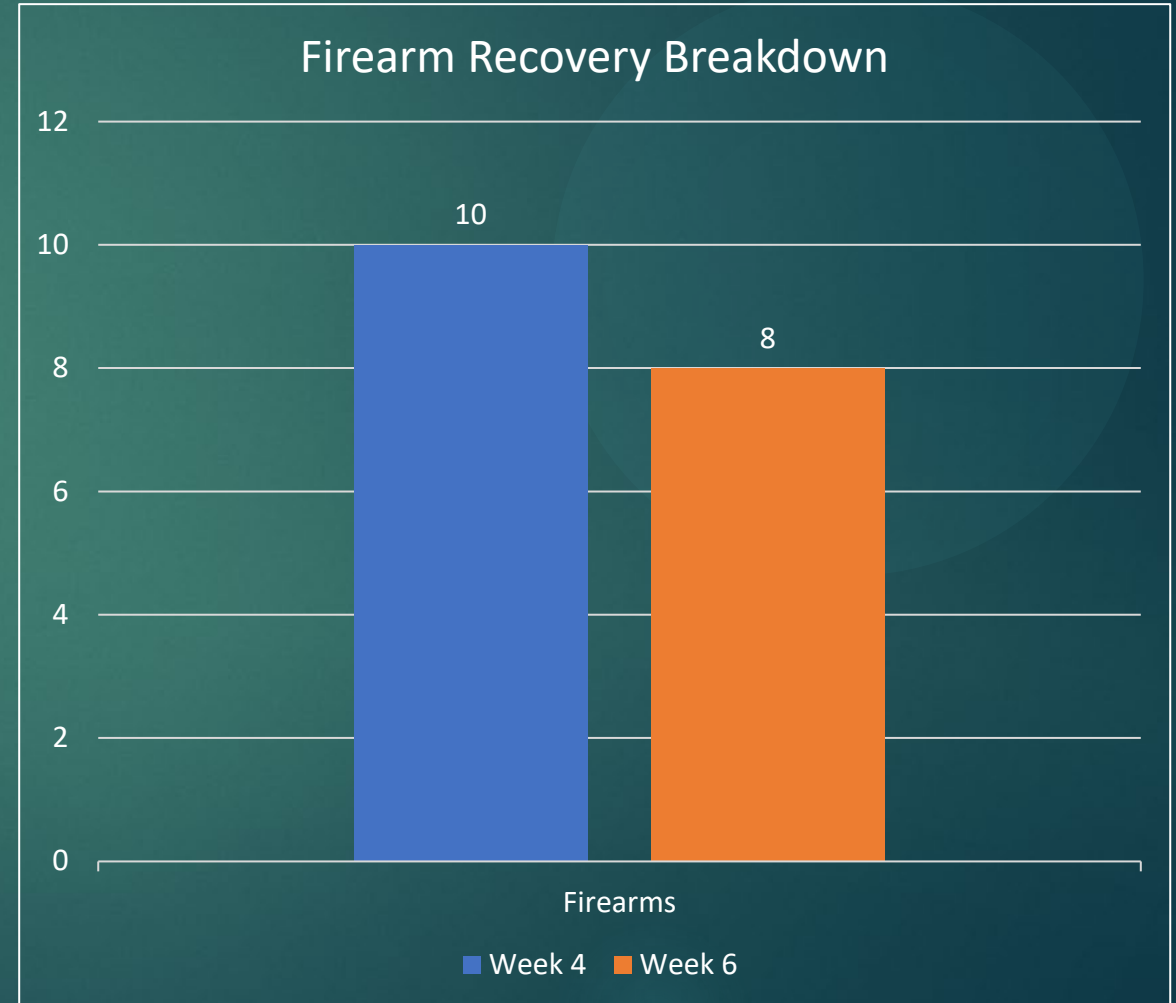
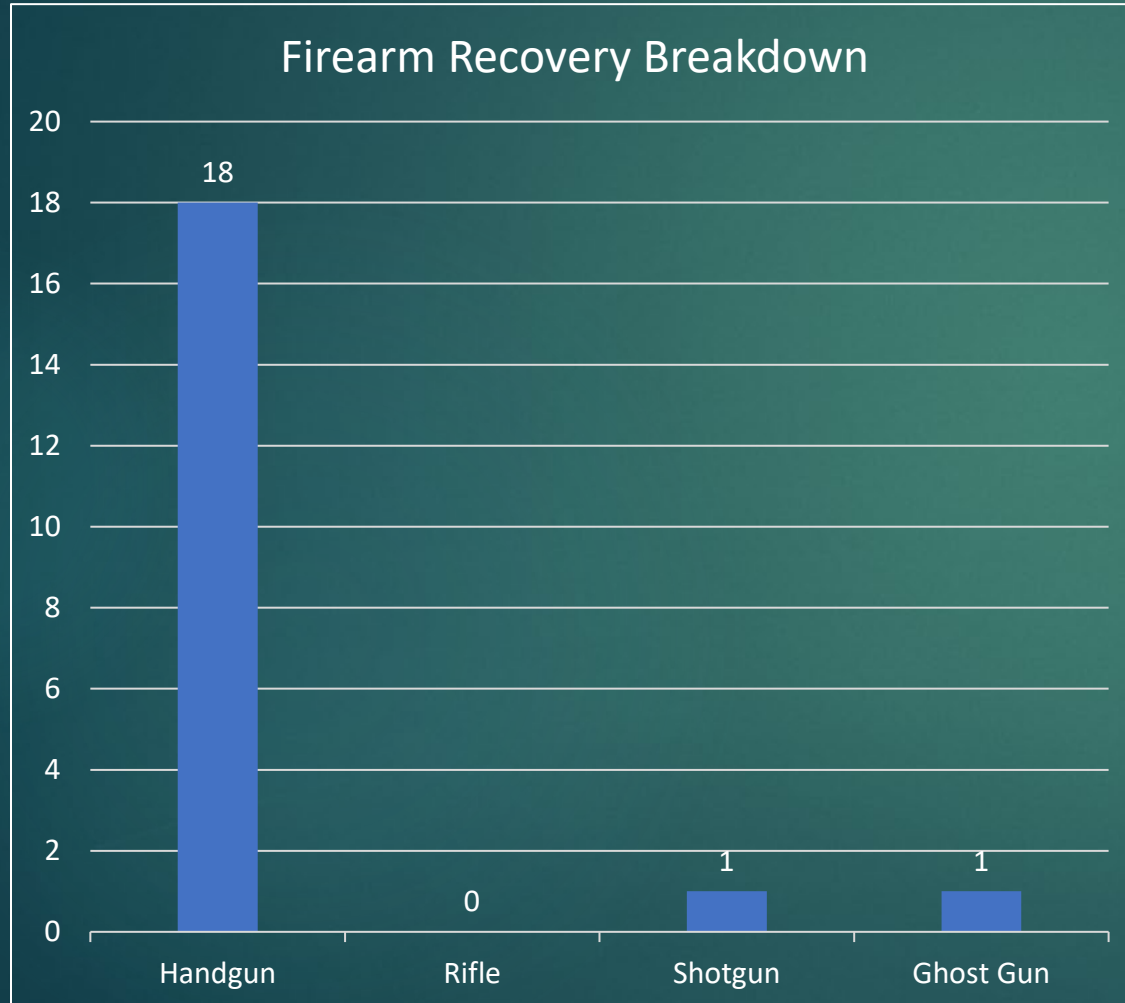
