ATLANTIC CITY PREPARES FOR SIGNIFICANT WINTER STORM BEGINNING SATURDAY NIGHT

The City of Atlantic City is preparing for a significant winter storm expected to impact the region beginning late Saturday evening, January 24, 2026, and continuing through Monday afternoon.

According to the National Weather Service, Atlantic City is forecast to receive up to 8 inches of snow. Snow is expected to begin late Saturday evening and continue through Sunday early afternoon when it is forecasted to change to rain.

The City of Atlantic City Department of Public Works began brining and salting roadways and will have crews deployed throughout the storm for plowing and additional treatment operations. Public Works, the Atlantic City Office of Emergency Management, the Atlantic City Police Department, and the Atlantic City Fire Department will have additional personnel and equipment on standby to respond as needed.

At the request of the City of Atlantic City's Office of Emergency Management, the New Jersey Casino Reinvestment Development Authority (CRDA) has authorized the Wave Parking Garage, located at the corner of Mississippi and Fairmount Avenues, to provide free parking for all Atlantic City residents and visitors from Saturday at noon through Tuesday at noon. Free parking is permitted on the second floor of the garage during this time period.

Residents and visitors are strongly urged to avoid unnecessary travel during the storm and to use extreme caution when driving, particularly during any period of mixed precipitation. Motorists should reduce speed, increase following distance, and yield to snow plows and emergency vehicles.

Atlantic City residents are encouraged to sign up for AC Alerts (<https://www.acnj.gov/pages/acalerts>) - the City's emergency notification system, to receive

text and email updates throughout the storm. The City also urges the public to monitor forecasts and advisories from the National Weather Service for the latest information.

Additional announcements regarding municipal operations, parking, trash collection, and emergency services will be issued as conditions warrant.
