With 29 years in the Atlantic City Police Department, she made history as the first female Deputy Chief, leading key units like the Emergency Response and Crisis Negotiation Teams. Honored with the Lifetime Achievement Award from the New Jersey Women in Law Enforcement, she is also a dedicated wife, mother, and community volunteer. Having once carried banners in this very parade, Bridget now leads it, embodying the spirit of service, leadership, and tradition
