# City of Atlantic City Government Offices Are Closed Monday (Jan. 6) Due to Expected Snow

**Atlantic City, N.J. (January 5, 2025)** – City of Atlantic City Mayor Marty Small, Sr. announced during a news conference this evening that City Hall and all City of Atlantic City government buildings will be closed on Monday, January 6, 2025 due to forecasted snow throughout the region. As of tonight, the National Weather Service has Atlantic City under a Winter Storm Warning. The City of Atlantic City Department of Public Works began treating the roads Friday morning and crews were out again this morning brining the streets. Crews will reopen facility operations at 1:00 AM Monday and will begin deploying crew members shortly after. There will be no trash collection in Atlantic City on Monday. Collection will be delayed by one day the rest of the week. Public Works, the Atlantic City Office of Emergency Management and the Atlantic City Police Department have extra staff and vehicles, including military surplus vehicles, on standby as needed.

At the request of the City of Atlantic City's Office of Emergency Management, the New Jersey Casino Reinvestment Development Authority (CRDA) has authorized the Wave Parking Garage, located at the corner of Mississippi and Fairmount Avenues, to provide free parking for all Atlantic City residents and visitors in effect as of this afternoon through 12:00 PM on Tuesday, January 7, 2025. Free parking is permitted on the second floor of the garage during this time period.

Atlantic City is currently under a Code Blue through at least 8:00 AM on Thursday, January 9, 2025 with temperatures forecasted to drop below 32 degrees at times during this period. During a Code Blue, the Atlantic City Rescue Mission opens its doors to all who need shelter and food.

The Atlantic City Police Department, as available, provides transportation to the Atlantic City Rescue Mission.

The City of Atlantic City urges residents and visitors to avoid unnecessary travel during and immediately after any heavy snowfall and to use extra caution when on the roadways. This includes traveling at a slower speed and keeping distance between other vehicles on the road, especially snow plows and emergency vehicles. Atlantic City residents can sign up for AC Alerts – Atlantic City’s emergency notification system – to receive text and email updates throughout the weekend. Please follow the National Weather Service for the latest forecast and snow totals.
