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Temporary Changes for City Hall Visitors as Atlantic City Courtyard Construction Project Begins April 8th

Atlantic City, N.J. (April 5, 2024) – Construction begins on the City Hall Courtyard enhancement project on Monday, April 8th, 2024 prompting temporary changes for City Hall visitors. Throughout construction, half of the City Hall main parking lot will not be accessible. Both parking lot entrances along South Carolina Avenue will be closed. City Hall visitors must enter and exit the parking lot along Arctic Avenue. Upon arrival, visitors are asked to see the parking attendant stationed outside the building on the South Carolina Avenue side, who will direct them to the appropriate location to park.

During construction, visitors must temporarily enter the building through the Tennessee Avenue entrance, and may exit the building on the Tennessee Avenue or South Carolina Avenue side. The main City Hall entrance through the courtyard will be closed. Visitors must continue to sign in at the front desk upon entry. There will be a handicapped entrance, along with designated handicapped parking spaces, on the South Carolina Avenue side.

In March, City of Atlantic City Mayor Marty Small, Sr. was joined by City, Atlantic County and State of New Jersey officials to break ground on the Courtyard enhancement project, which incorporates environmentally responsible renewable energy concepts and enhanced security and safety features. The courtyard will be renamed Lt. Governor Sheila Y. Oliver Plaza, in honor of the late New Jersey Lieutenant Governor. Construction work is anticipated to continue until the Fall.

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
