Temporary Parking Lot Changes Start Today for City Hall Visitors in Atlantic City

Atlantic City, N.J. (April 24, 2025) – As the City of Atlantic City Courtyard enhancement project enters its final stages of construction, starting today, until further notice, vehicles will only be able to enter the parking lot through the South Carolina Avenue entrance. From the start of the project until now, the South Carolina Avenue entrance was blocked off and motorists had to enter the lot through the Arctic Avenue entrance. As of today, the Arctic Avenue entrance is blocked off. Visitors are asked to park in spaces clearly labeled “visitor” only. As has been the case since the start of the project, visitors still must enter the building using the entrance on the Tennessee Avenue side of the building and sign in at the front desk. The entrance on the South Carolina Avenue side of the building remains for employees only.

Construction on “Lieutenant Governor Sheila Y. Oliver Plaza” – named in honor of the late New Jersey Lieutenant Governor – began in March of 2024. The project incorporates enhanced security and safety features at the main entrance, along with aesthetic improvements such as fixed and built-in benches throughout the courtyard, a rain garden, a marble fountain, a pergola, the painting of existing concrete walls and the planting of beautiful trees, shrubs and grass, plus the new main and north end parking lots. The project is scheduled to be completed this spring at which point all entrances to the parking lot will be open and visitors will once again be able to enter the building through the main entrance.
