

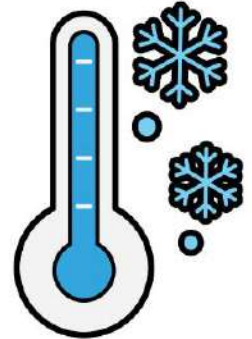

Use Extra Caution on Roads and Sidewalks

- Reduce driving speeds and allow extra stopping distance
- Watch for black ice, especially during early morning and evening hours
- Wear footwear with good traction when walking
- Use handrails and avoid shortcuts across icy surfaces

Conditions may remain slippery even after plowing and salting operations are completed.



Operational Conditions/Ongoing Response

Public Safety officials note that this winter weather event is unusual for our region and presents conditions that occur only infrequently.

Atlantic City's snow and ice response capabilities are designed for typical winter storms experienced in this area. Preparing for storms of this severity — which occur only once every 10 to 15 years — would require resources and equipment that are not practical or cost-effective for taxpayers on a routine basis.

In addition, the prolonged period of extreme cold has reduced the effectiveness of traditional rock salt, limiting the ability to fully eliminate ice in some areas despite continued treatment efforts.

Residents are asked to bear with crews as Public Works and public safety personnel continue mitigation operations under challenging conditions.

Officials also remind residents that another potentially hazardous winter storm is forecast for this weekend. Continued caution and preparation are strongly encouraged.

As always, residents are encouraged to check on their neighbors, especially those who are elderly or have mobility issues. Allow extra time to get where you need to go and try to travel only when necessary.
