**Concern: Regarding trash disposal at Short Term Rental properties**

**A:**

**L & I:** The inspection process includes determining the number of trash totes a particular property is required to have. That is determined during the inspection of the property and is based upon the number of tenants, the occupancy load. In fact, the number of trash totes required is included on the Short Term Rental License.

**Concern: Regarding parking at Short Term Rental properties**

A:

**L & I:** Parking is an issue throughout shore communities. To assist in addressing this, the Department of Licensing & Inspections has retained Host Compliance, a 24/7 Hot Line Service. This service receives and records **ALL** complaints and inquiries. My office responds to **EVERY CALL**, contacting the person who lodged the complaint, and the property owner or manager.

If a property has continuous complaints/issues, appropriate action is taken by the Department of Licensing & Inspections, which could include suspension or termination

**ACPD: Four calls for service associated with 29 S. South Carolina Avenue and parking lot since July 1. All for quality of life issues. A keep a check has been added to this area for patrol officers to drive/walk/bike through the area and look for quality of life issues**

Q:

**Concern: Issues at specific beaches**

A:

**ACPD:** Since June 1, there have been 133 calls for service in the Caspian Ave area for a variety of complaints. Sixty-three of the calls were generated through 911 or tip411. The remaining 70 were initiated by the police officer or was a designated check of the area

**Solicitor's Office:** Accordingly: The City of Atlantic City is vested with broad discretion for the exercise and deployment of their assets to enforce local laws and regulations. When facing competing demands it is within the City's discretion to determine whether and how to utilize and apply existing resources. This Discretion should not be applied in a manner that is based upon viewpoint or is uneven in application. The public has the right to voice their concerns as to enforcement to the proper decision-makers. Thereafter, an analysis will be performed to discover any inequities and enforcement.

**Concern: Drug use and homeless issue**

A:

**ACPD: 103 S. Texas Ave** – The calls for service in the area have dropped significantly from 583 to 231 over a one-month comparison period. This can be associated with proactive enforcement in the area and a cooperative effort between the police department and Licensing & Inspection to combat quality of life issues. There have been numerous arrests in this area for a variety of offenses that include weapon possession and narcotic distribution

**HHS: 126 S. Bellevue Ave** – No homeless were near the location. Working with the Social Services Providers along with the State of NJ to help address the homeless problem. More details will follow in the near future

# Junior Police Academy- Neighborhood Coordination Unit (Commanded by Lt. Will Santiago)

Over the last several weeks, the ACPD held their annual Junior Police Academy for 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade Atlantic City students. There were two 2-week sessions held at Sovereign Avenue and Pennsylvania Avenue schools. The purpose of the academy is to educate the recruits about being a first responder with training from police, fire, EMS, beach patrol, and more. Recruits are provided with field trips, hands on instruction, and physical training by NCU officers.

The main goal of the program is for these young people to understand, learn and develop core skills such as integrity, honor, duty, and commitment. Their training will also allow them to develop leadership and teamwork skills that will prepare them for success.

All 89 recruits and all those that provided instruction are to be recognized for a job well done!

# Officer Jonathan Walsh, Sergeant Michael Tracy, Detective Thomas McCabe, (Commanded by Lt. F. Timek)

On July 5, patrol officers responded to the 300 block of Rosemont Place in reference to a woman being held against her will, and the suspect was armed with a handgun. Additionally, information was provided that the suspect was having a mental health episode.

Shortly after officers arrived, the victim ran out of the residence. Officers took up a tactical position around the residence to contact the suspect. The suspect exited the home onto a balcony where Officer Walsh engaged him in conversation. After a discussion, the suspect agreed to leave the residence. He surrendered shortly after and was taken into custody without incident. The suspect was found in possession of cocaine.

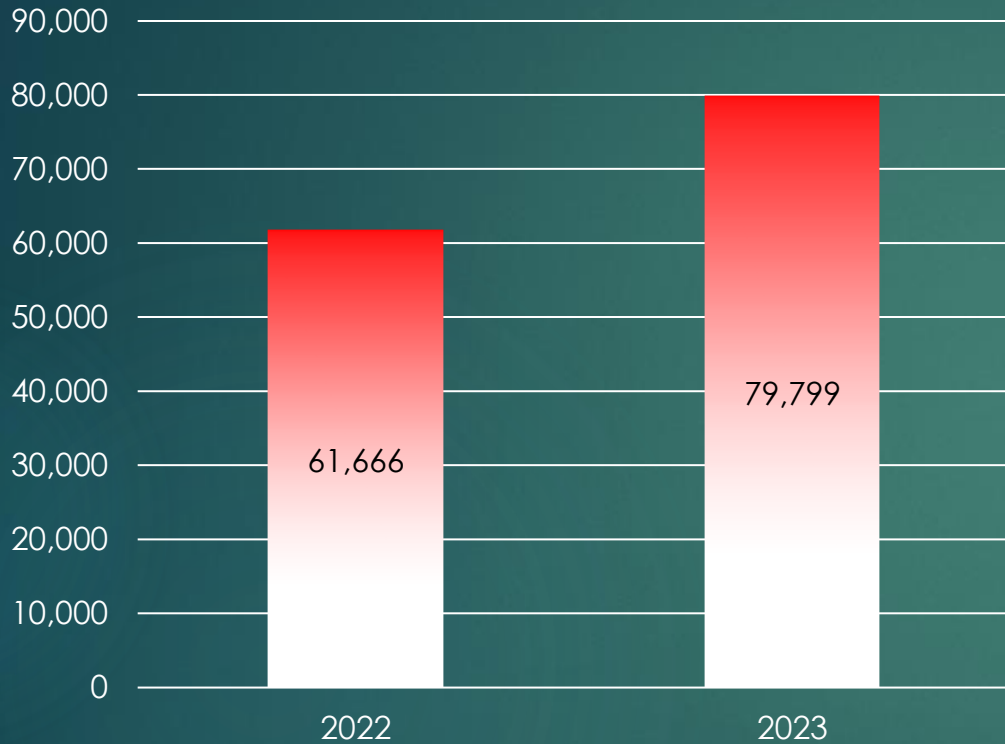
It was learned that the suspect pointed a handgun at the victim during an argument. The investigation was turned over to Detective McCabe and Sergeant Tracy. A court ordered search warrant was authorized for the residence. During the search, Sergeant Tracy located two handguns.

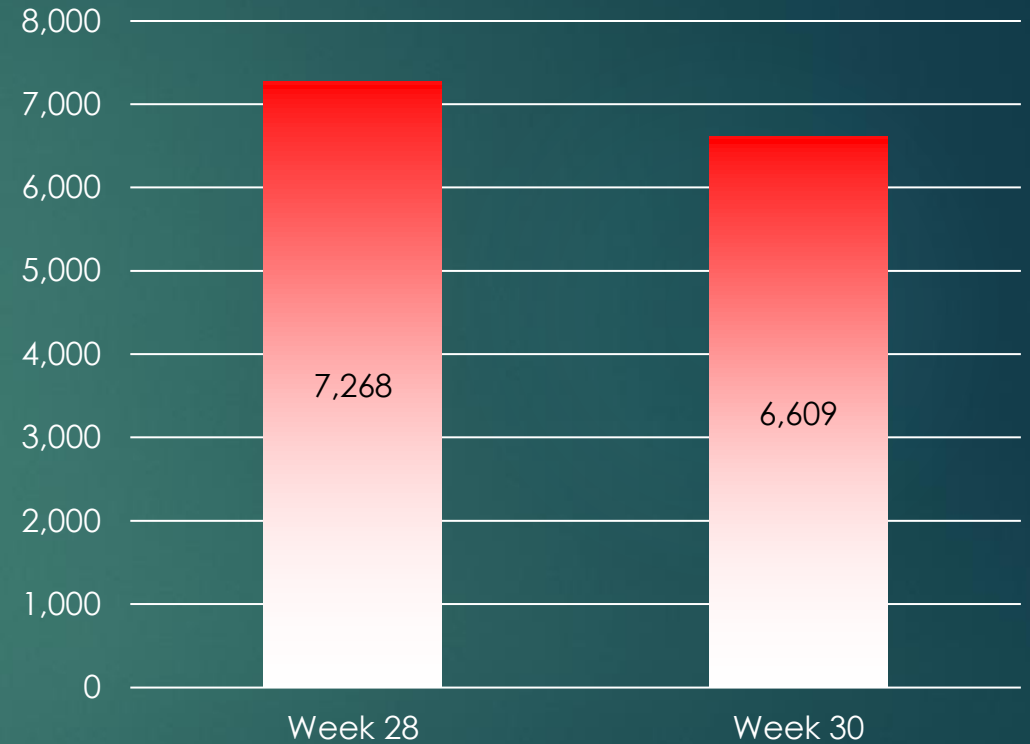
# Calls for Service Overview

## CFS (Year to Date Comparison)



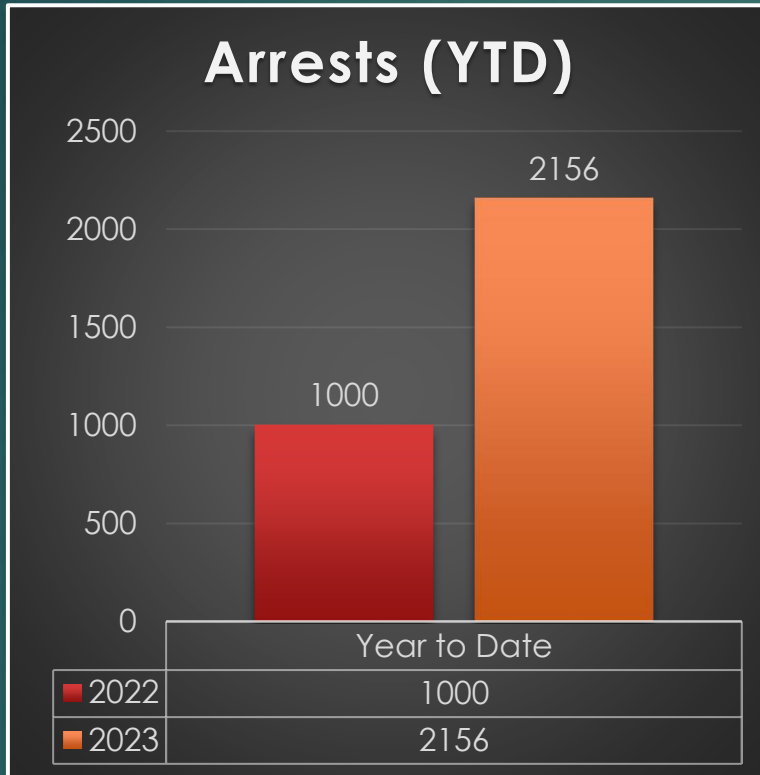
Calls for Service are up **29%** in 2023 vs 2022 YTD.


## CFS (2 Week Comparison)

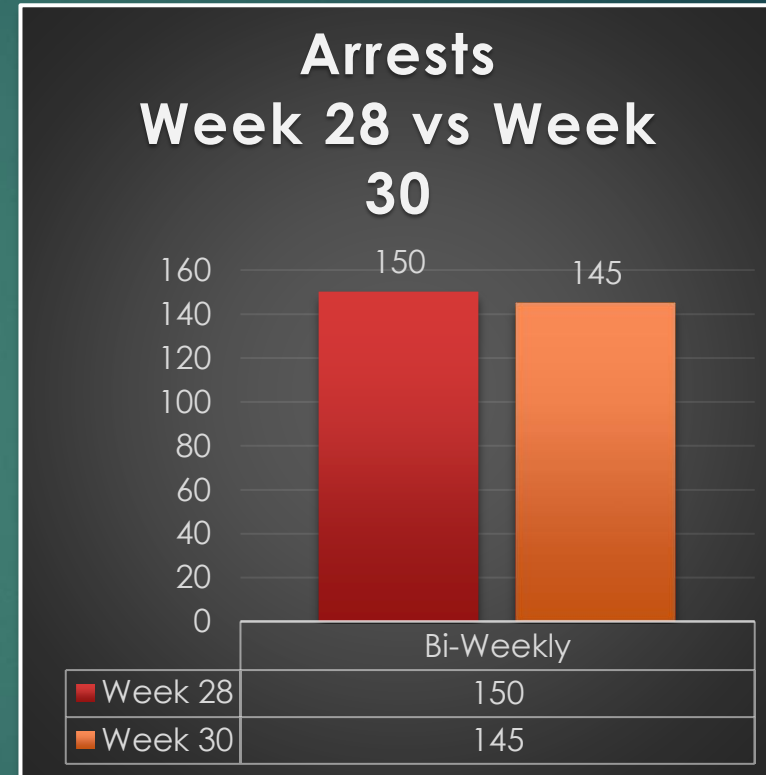


Calls for Service are down **-9%** from Week 28 vs Week 30

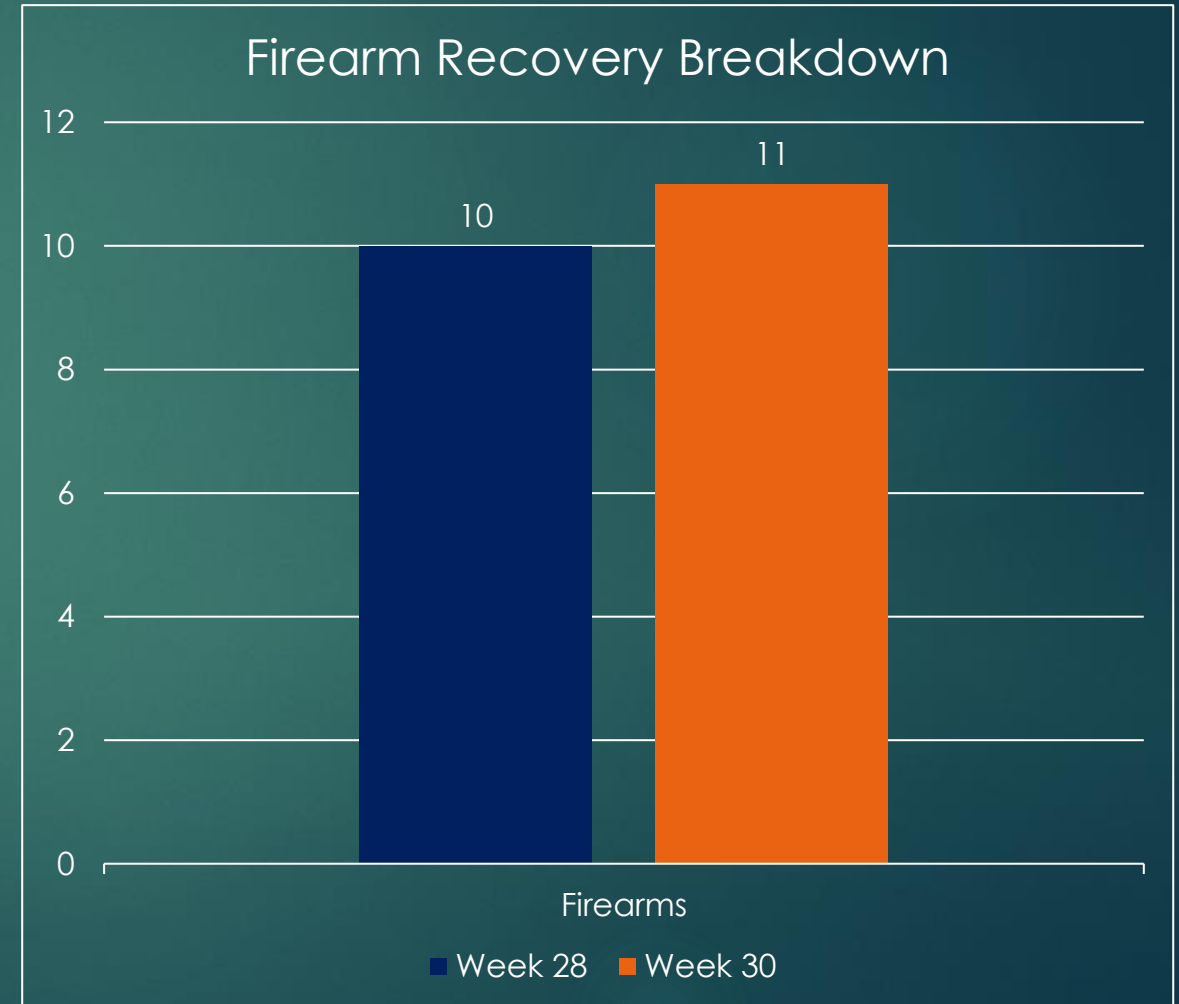
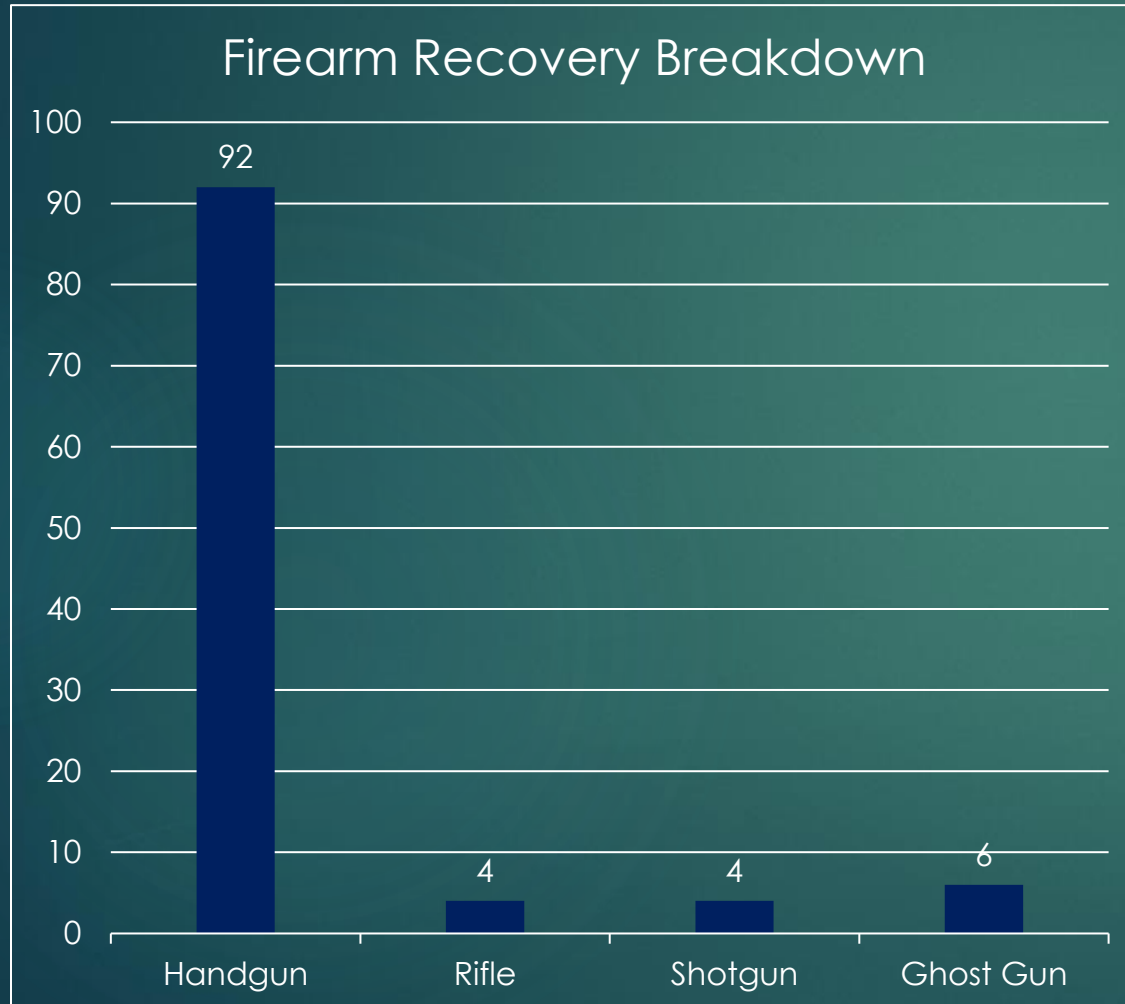

The ACPD is distributing free steering wheel locks to Hyundai and Kia owners in an effort to deter the theft of these vehicle brands. These vehicles continue to be the most popular cars and SUVs for car thieves, particularly younger individuals.

The ACPD has already distributed many steering wheel locks, but have plenty more that will be distributed, for free, to residents that own a Hyundai or Kia. Simply bring your affected vehicle or a copy of your registration and your driver's license to the Clayton G. Graham Public Safety Building (2715 Atlantic Avenue) and we will provide you with a free lock.

Steering wheel locks can be picked up:

Monday – Friday, between the hours of 8:00 AM – 3:00PM.

Hyundai will reimburse owners for steering wheel locks for those who have already purchased them. Additionally, Hyundai will soon offer reimbursement options for other anti-theft equipment such as alarm systems.
