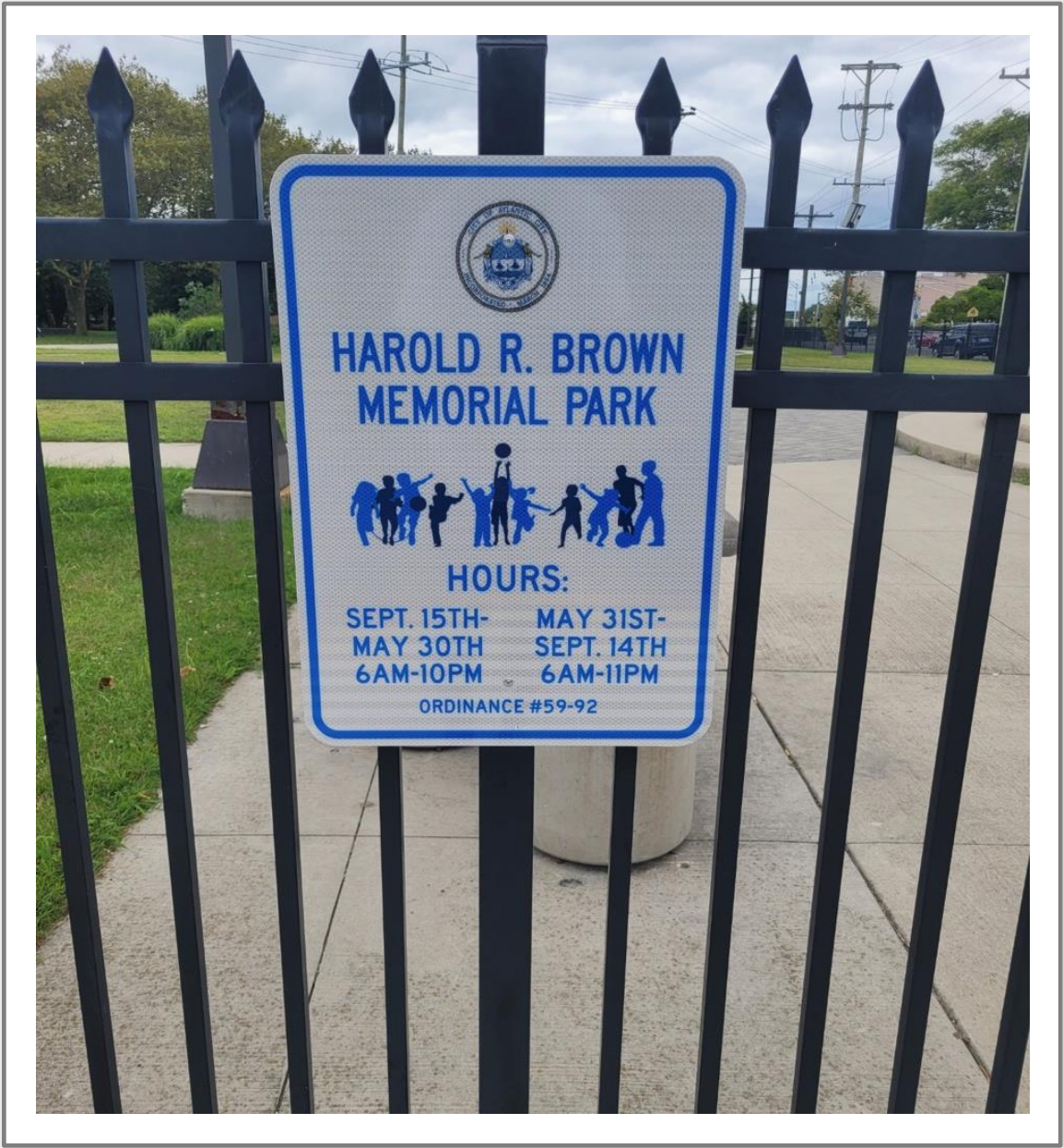

HHS: We are working with our legal department to develop verbiage to disseminate to the area regarding the importance of leaving raw food out. We have spoken to residents (in the same area) in the past about this issue.

ACPD: Neighborhood Coordination Unit officers responded to the residence of the complainant to learn more about the issue. The officers talked to the residents at the addresses listed and both denied leaving food outside the home.

Q:

Concern: Concerns about Caspian Ave Beach and Kushner Lot

A:

ACPD: During the period of July 24 to August 6, the ACPD has either initiated or responded to 113 calls for service in the area. Ninety-three were keep-a-checks that are officer generated and involve roving patrol of a designated area with enforcement of quality-of-life issues and vehicles that are in violation. There were four noise complaints, five calls for vehicles being in violation, and several other different types of calls for service that occurred one or two times.

Parking Enforcement has also been deployed to this area to ensure that vehicles are parked in accordance with the traffic laws

Concern: Can the vacant lot in South Carolina area be monitored and restricted so that there isn't a propagation for drug use and sale?

A.

ACPD: Officers conducted frequent keep-a-checks that are officer generated and involve roving patrol of a designated area with enforcement of quality-of-life issues and violations. There were no calls for service in this area that were initiated by a call to 911.

Q: **Concern:** What can be done to stop what's going on at New York and Pacific Aves?

A: **ACPD:** Neighborhood Coordination Unit officers have been deployed into the area. During the last 14 days, multiple City ordinances have been issued addressing quality of life issues. 105 keep-a-checks that are officer generated and involve roving patrol of a designated area with enforcement of quality-of-life issues and other violations occurred.

**RECOGNITION ON A JOB
WELL DONE**

Detectives Aaron Jones and Ivaylo Ivanov (Violent Crimes Unit) K9 Officer Jesse Oliver-Logan and K9 Gee (Bravo 1 Patrol)

Detectives Jones and Ivanov received information that there was a stolen vehicle in the rear of the 900 block of Atlantic Avenue. The Dodge vehicle had been reported stolen from Delaware County, Pennsylvania.

After arriving at the location, the detectives located the vehicle and observed four men occupying and dismantling the stolen vehicle with mechanical tools. All four men were arrested.

During the investigation, a satchel was located which contained a handgun loaded with hollow-point ammunition. K9 Officer Oliver-Logan and his K9 partner Gee, trained in narcotic detection, arrived to assist. K9 Gee gave a positive indication for the presence of narcotics in a nearby vehicle that one of the suspects was using. Detectives later recovered three grams of cocaine and 17 bags of heroin concealed in a child car seat. Detectives also located seven key fobs belonging to unknown vehicles either in possession of the arrested individuals or within the tools that were being used to dismantle the Dodge.

Detectives Alberto Valles, Eric Evans, and Christopher Dodson (Commanded by Lt. Richard Andrews)

On August 2, Detectives Valles, Evans, and Dodson received information on two separate occasions regarding individuals distributing narcotics. The first suspect was located and arrested in the parking lot of Renaissance Plaza. The second suspect was arrested in the area of Tennessee and Magellan Avenues.

During these two arrests, the detectives recovered a stolen handgun, 43 grams of cocaine, 53 grams of marijuana, and paraphernalia used in the distribution of narcotics.

Officers John Bell, Kyle Bender, Robert Reynolds, K9 Officer Melvin Murray III and K9 Jynx- (Commanded by Lt. William Tracy)

On July 31, Officer Bell saw a wanted man and two others in the 500 block of South Carolina Avenue. The man was wanted following an incident at a home where he became involved in an altercation with a resident and fired a gunshot.

Officer Bell observed the men, they entered and exited a vehicle. When Officer Bell approached, the wanted man fled on foot. Officers Bender and Reynolds apprehended the man after a short foot pursuit. While fleeing, he discarded a bag that contained more than 12 grams of cocaine and ecstasy.

K9 Officer Murray III and his K9 partner, Jynx, who is trained in narcotic detection, alerted officers to the presence of narcotics in the vehicle that the men had entered. Officers learned the other two men entered a nearby residence, but not before removing items from the vehicle.

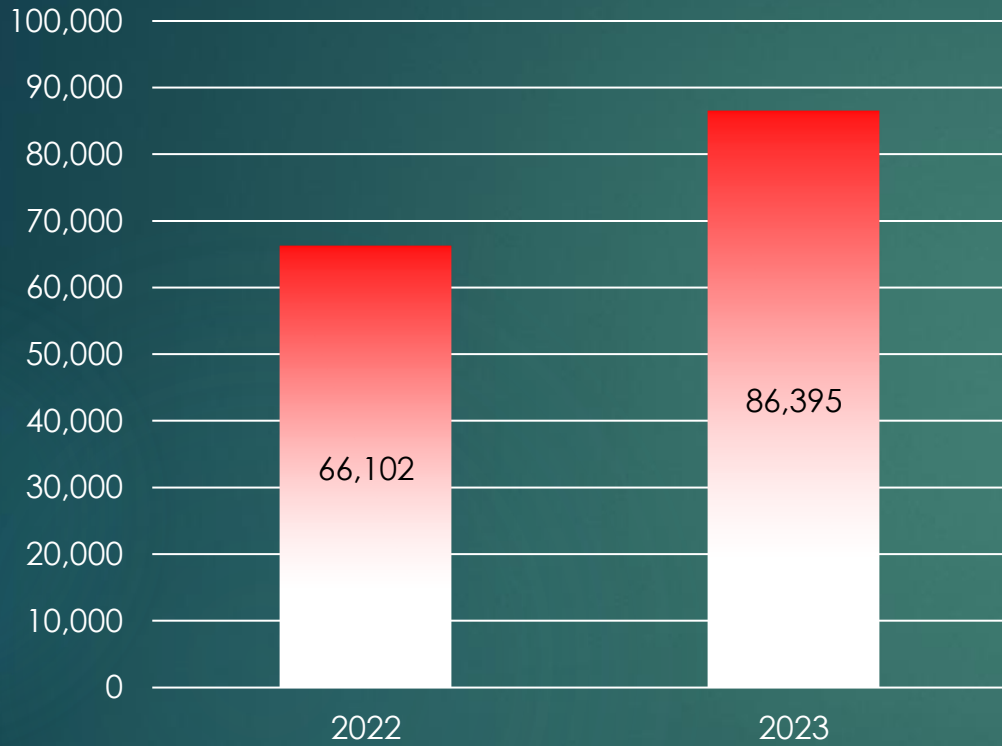
A court ordered search warrant was executed at the residence. Officers recovered a rifle, several different brands of ammunition, 345 grams of marijuana, heroin, and paraphernalia used in the distribution of narcotics. The two men were arrested.

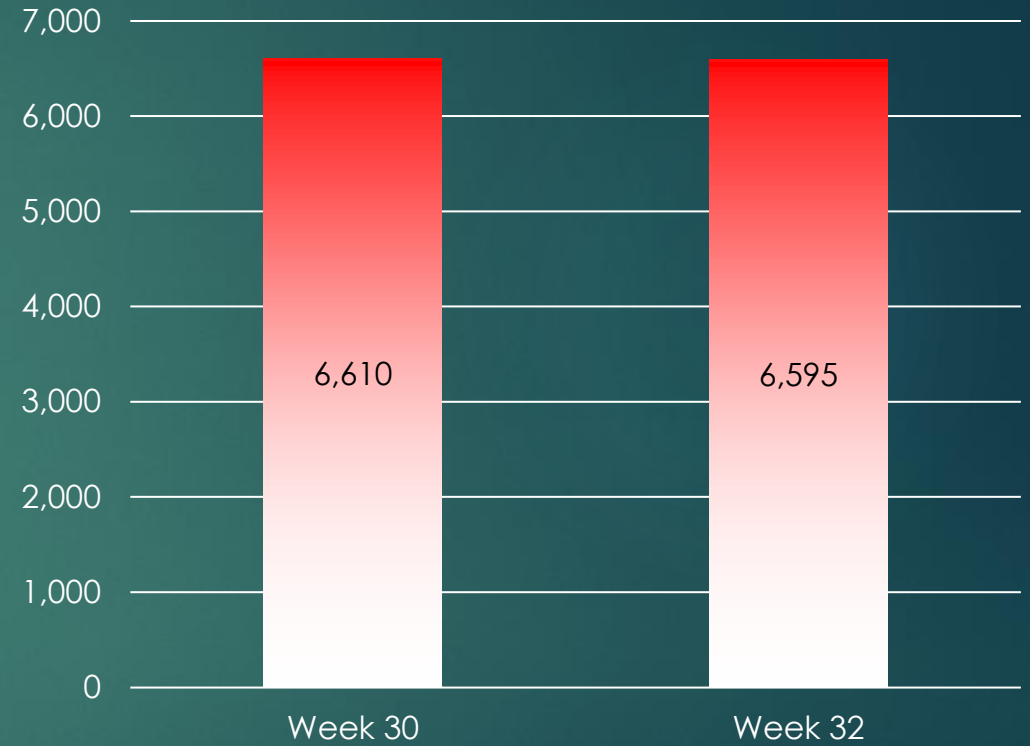
Calls for Service Overview

CFS (Year to Date Comparison)



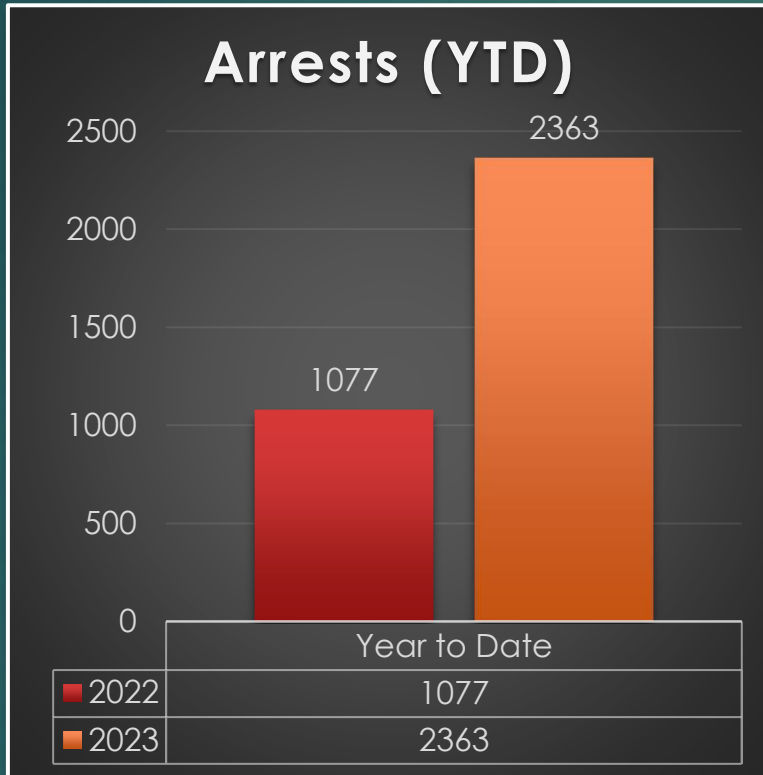
Calls for Service are up **31%** in 2023 vs 2022 YTD.


CFS (2 Week Comparison)

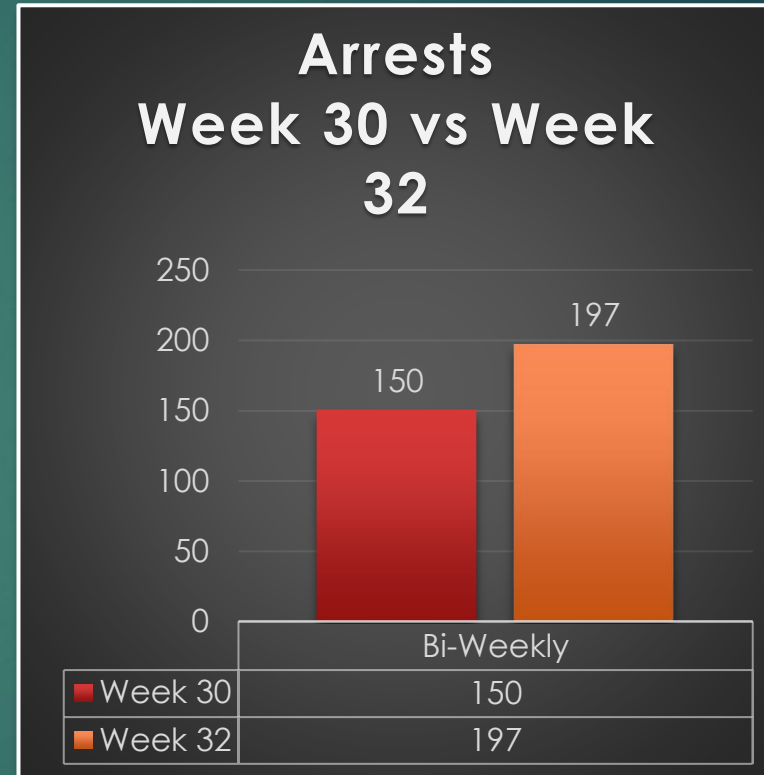



Calls for Service are down **.22% (Relatively Unchanged)** from Week 30 vs Week 32

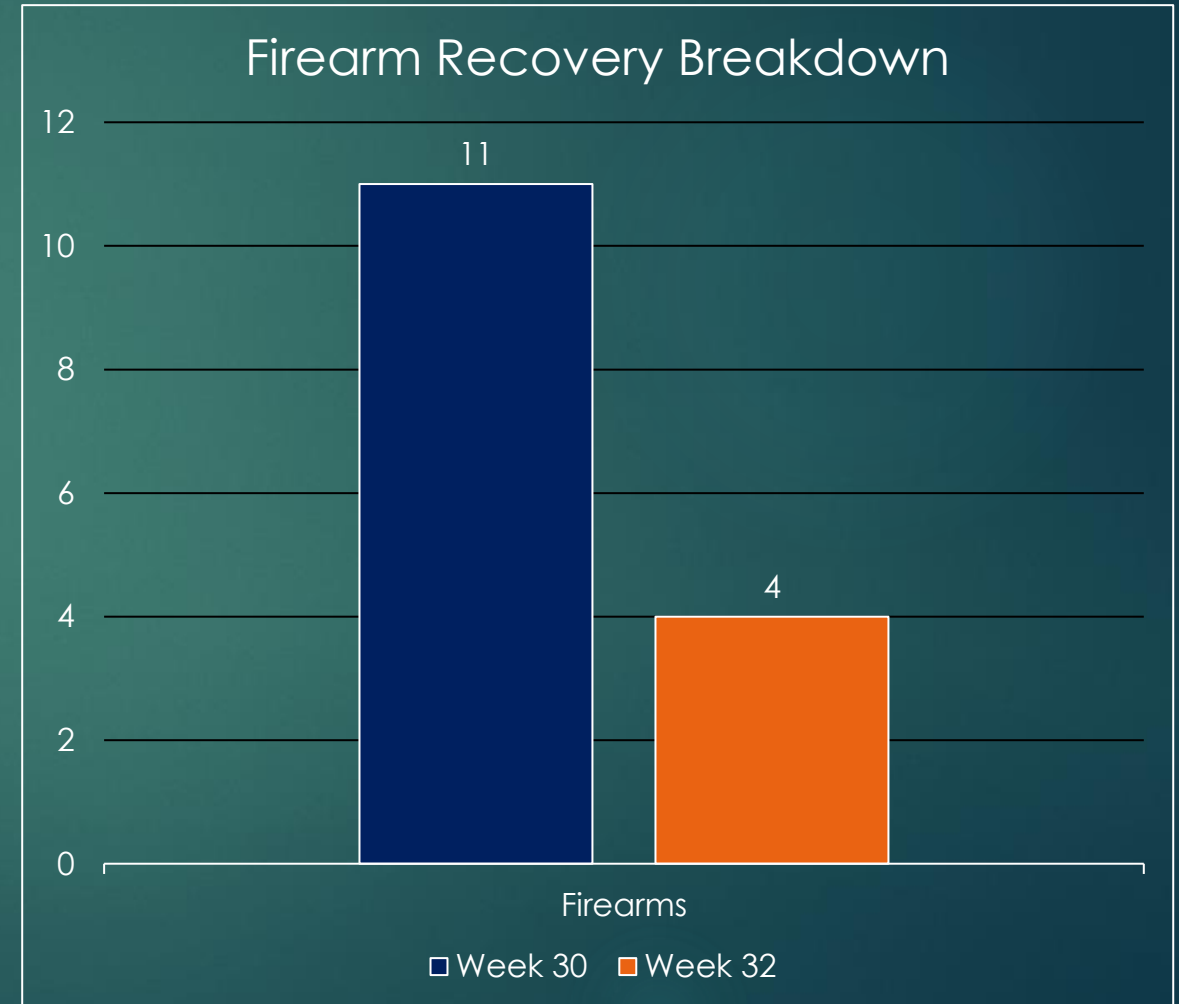
